About The Music

Kyong Mee Choi's *Undulation* for string quartet (2020, 9'20") was commissioned by Elliot Lee for the Korean Immigrant/Refuge benefit concert. As a part of the commission request, the piece incorporates thematic material from Korea's popular folksong, *Milyang Arirang*.

Journey to Northern Ontario (2022,7') is for a solo member of the oboe family. Patricia Morehead conceived the music during a drive to the gold and silver mining areas of Ontario. Autumnal color changes in the Precambrian Shield, earth's oldest rock formation, served as inspiration.

Kaleidoscope (i. *realizations*, ii. *mirrors*, iii. *confetti*) for string quartet reflects a kaleidoscope filled with colors of a 12-tone row. Row permutations and col legno battuto (wood of the bow) create colorful effects. This concert features i. *realizations* only-- Regina Harris Baiocchi, 2020, 5.5'


For Mark (June 2010, 5') for solo cello was composed by Patricia Morehead for composer Mark Anthony Turnage's 50th birthday. When Turnage was Composer-in-Residence with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, he co-taught composition with Dr. Morehead at Merit School of Music.

Ester Hanviriyapunt wrote *Monteber Suite*: I-III (2022, 11') to honor her hometown's blind guitarist-composer. Prof. Heber Bartolome inspired people in Cebu, Philippines, to appreciate folk music. The three parts of this suite for piano quintet can be played together or separately.

Ellipse (2009, 13′) by Janice Misurell-Mitchell is for baritone saxophone, violin, viola, and cello. It was commissioned by composer and saxophonist Mark Engebretson. *Ellipse* is dedicated to the memory of the composer's dear, late friend and mentor, M. William Karlins (1932 – 2005).

Deliverance (2021, 4.5') was commissioned for Access Contemporary Music's "Songs About Buildings" re: First Church of Deliverance in Chicago's Bronzeville. Solo piano music conjures Praise & Worship songs, using syncopated rhythms, "worried notes," and triplet gospel feel.

Kyong Mee Choi is a composer, visual artist, painter, organist, and poet who received several prestigious awards including John Simon Guggenheim Fellowship, Robert Helps Prize, Aaron Copland Award, John Donald Robb Musical Trust Fund, et al. She is a Professor and Director of Music Composition at Roosevelt University where she teaches composition and electro-acoustic music. Her opera, *Pale Courage*, received its world premiere at Merle Reskin Theatre this year to critical acclaim. Pianist and composer **Esther "Hana" Hanviriyapunt** performs music of many genres in solo and ensemble settings. For twenty-five years she was Co-Artistic Director of Chicago's CUBE Contemporary Chamber Ensemble; she now performs in numerous Chicago new music venues and with Freedom From and Freedom To, an improvisatory dance and music ensemble.
